- Teaching University
- Enrollment – 10,316
 - Undergraduate – 6,336
 - Incoming Freshman – 1,447
- Campuses in St. Paul, Minneapolis, Rome, and Owatonna
- Gender - ~50/50
- Minnesota Residence – 81%

Post Baccalaureate Enrollment

- Enrolled within one year – 16%
- Enrolled within three years – 25%
- Enrolled within five years – 34%
- Graduation rates
 - Two year – 17%
 - Three year – 35%
 - Four year – 46%
 - Five or more years – 56%

- Occupation Employment Data
- Available Measures
 - Employer
 - Industry
 - Hours worked
 - Salary
- 2004-2010 (~16,000 students)
- 92% Match

DEED Data Limitations

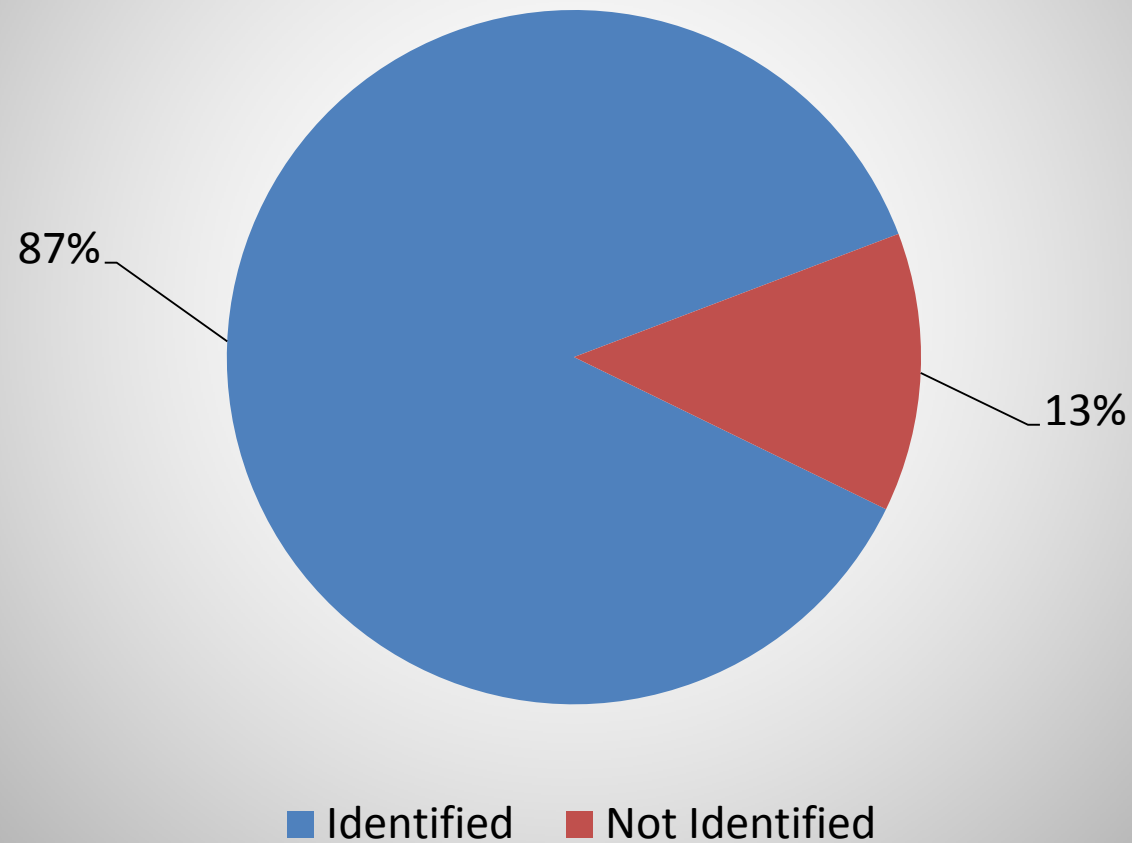
- Secondary data
- Missing data
- Federal, state, independent contractors, non-profits participation voluntary
- Definition development

Employment Type Definitions (Class of 2005)

- First year complete – UST student associated with a total of 2,080 hours or more one year after graduating
- Fourth year complete – UST student associated with a total of 2,080 hours or more four years after graduating
- Not complete – UST student associated with less than 2,080 hours after one or four years of graduating
- Enrolled – UST student enrolled in college after completing their baccalaureate degree and <2,080 hours

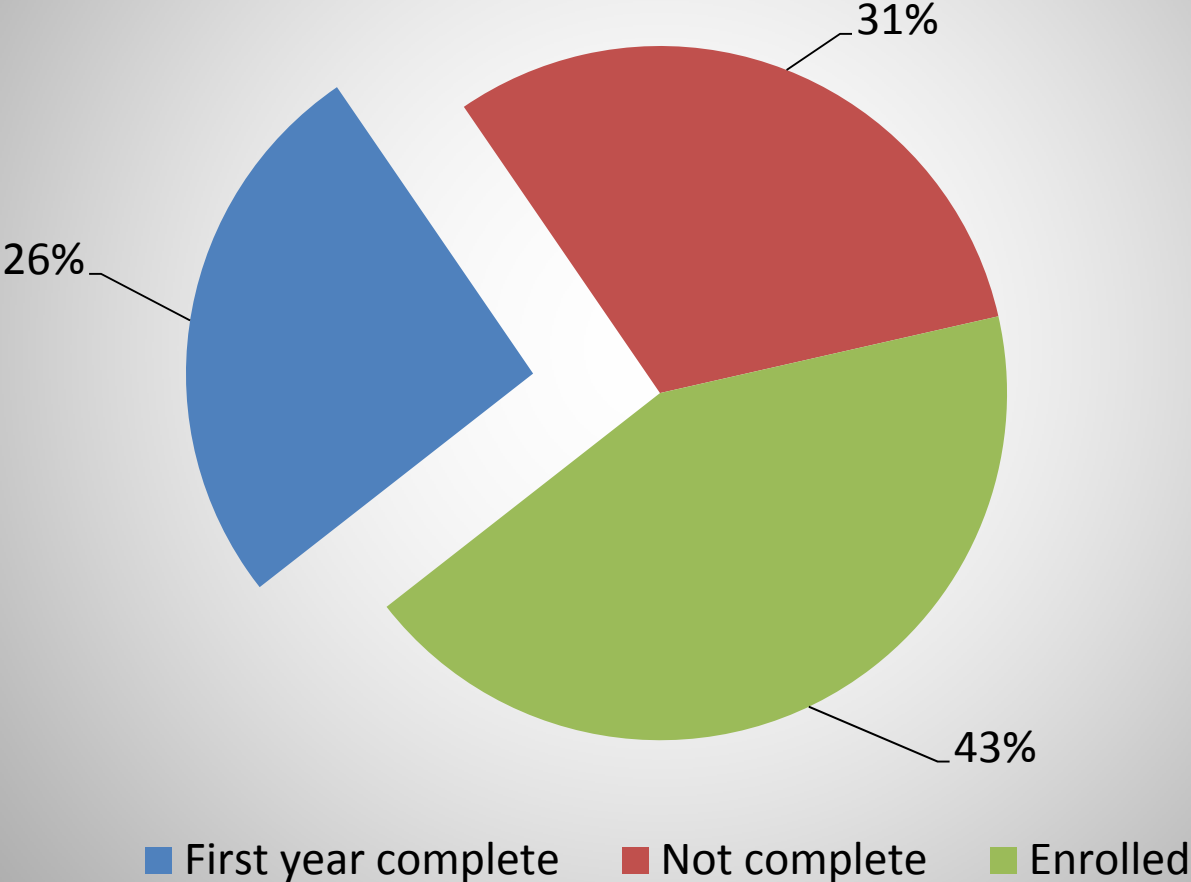

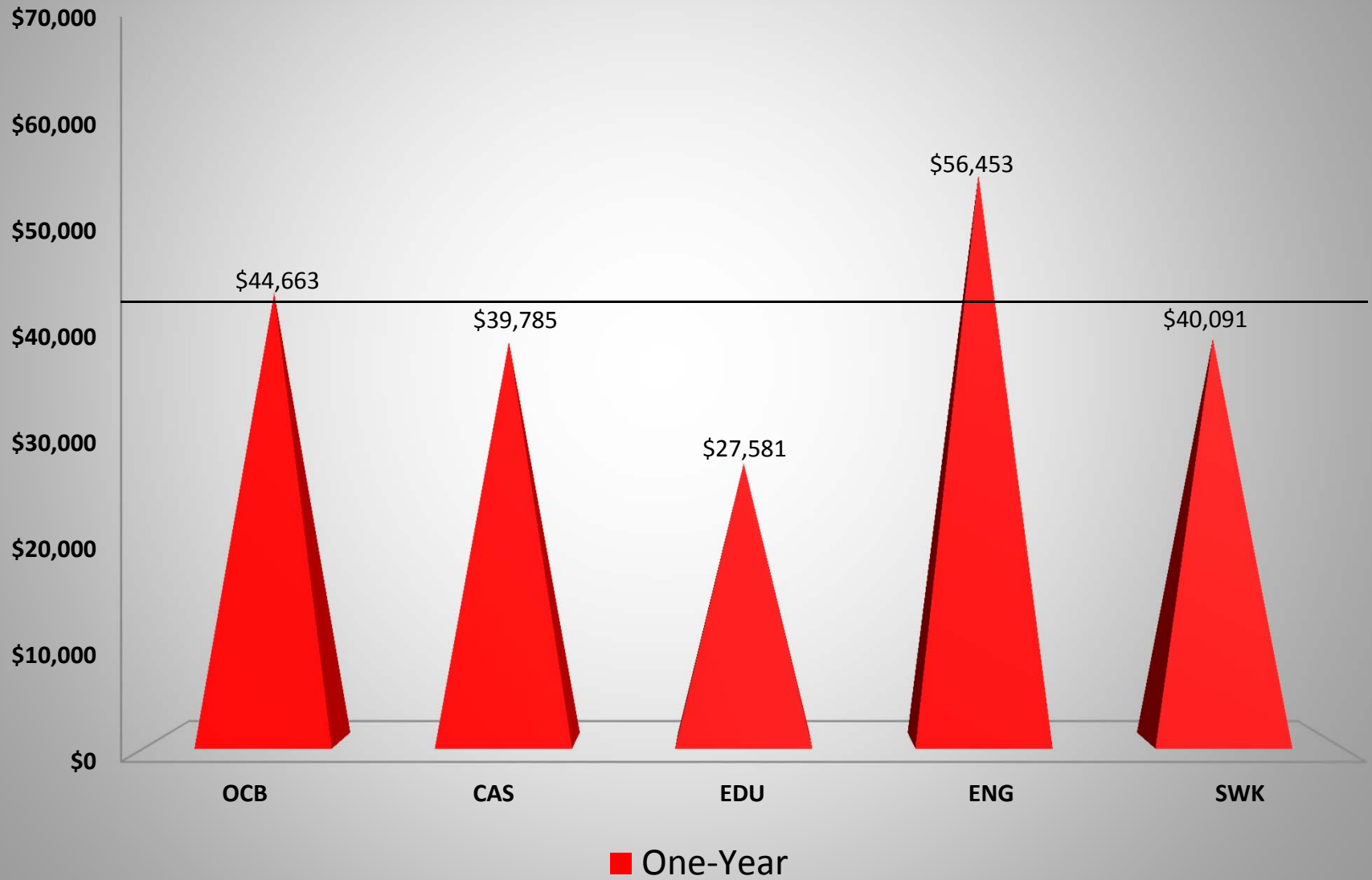

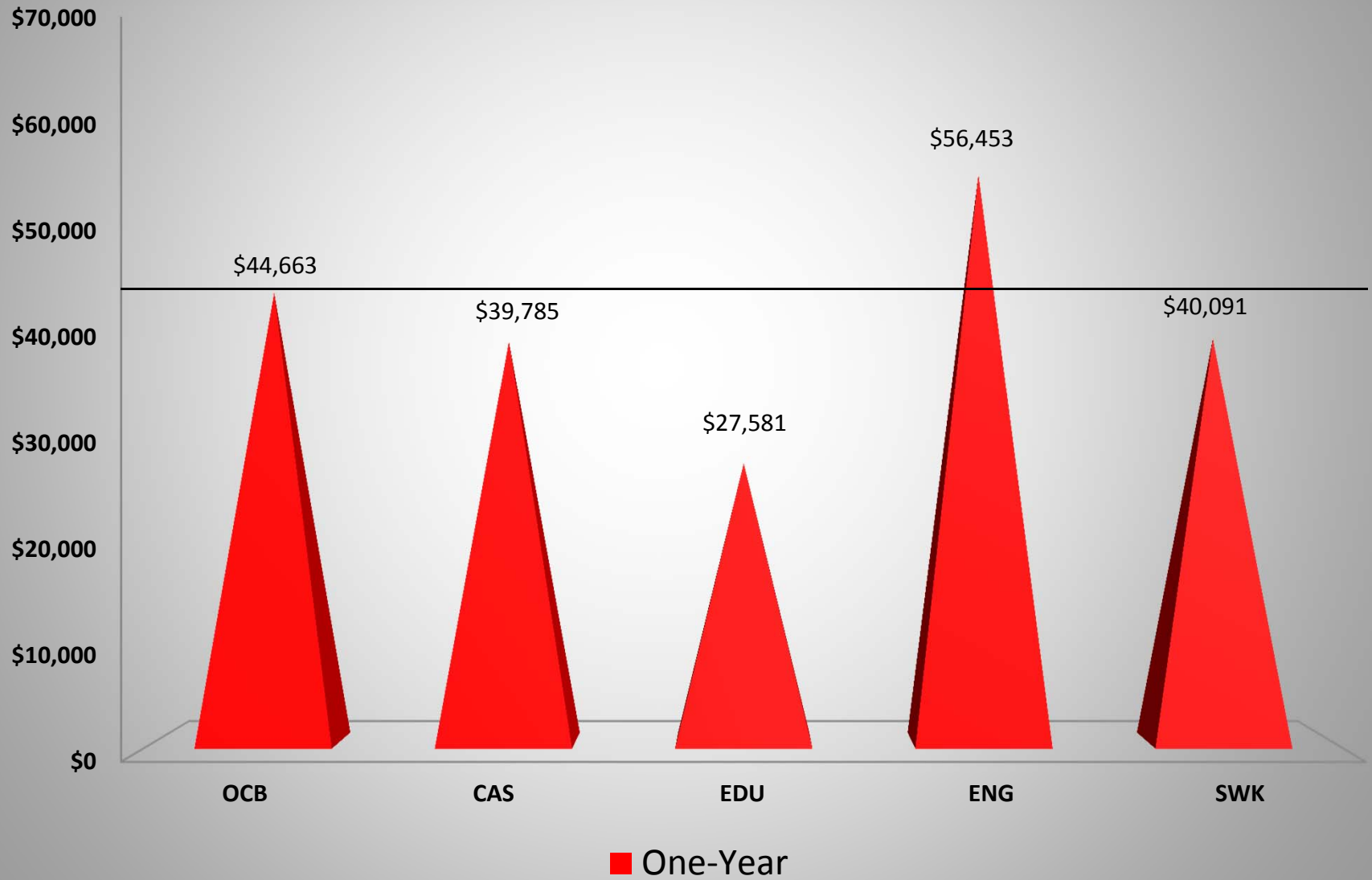

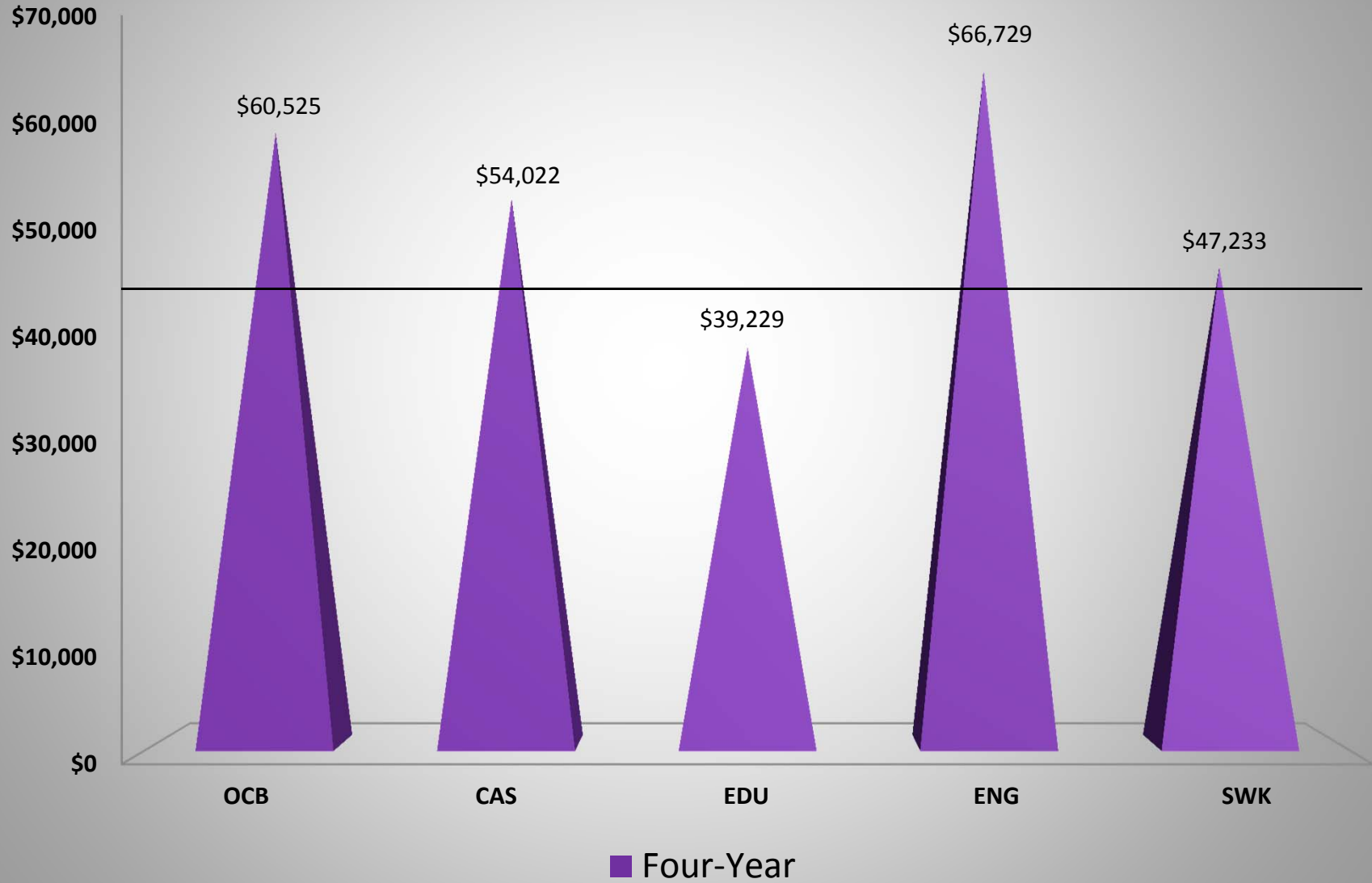

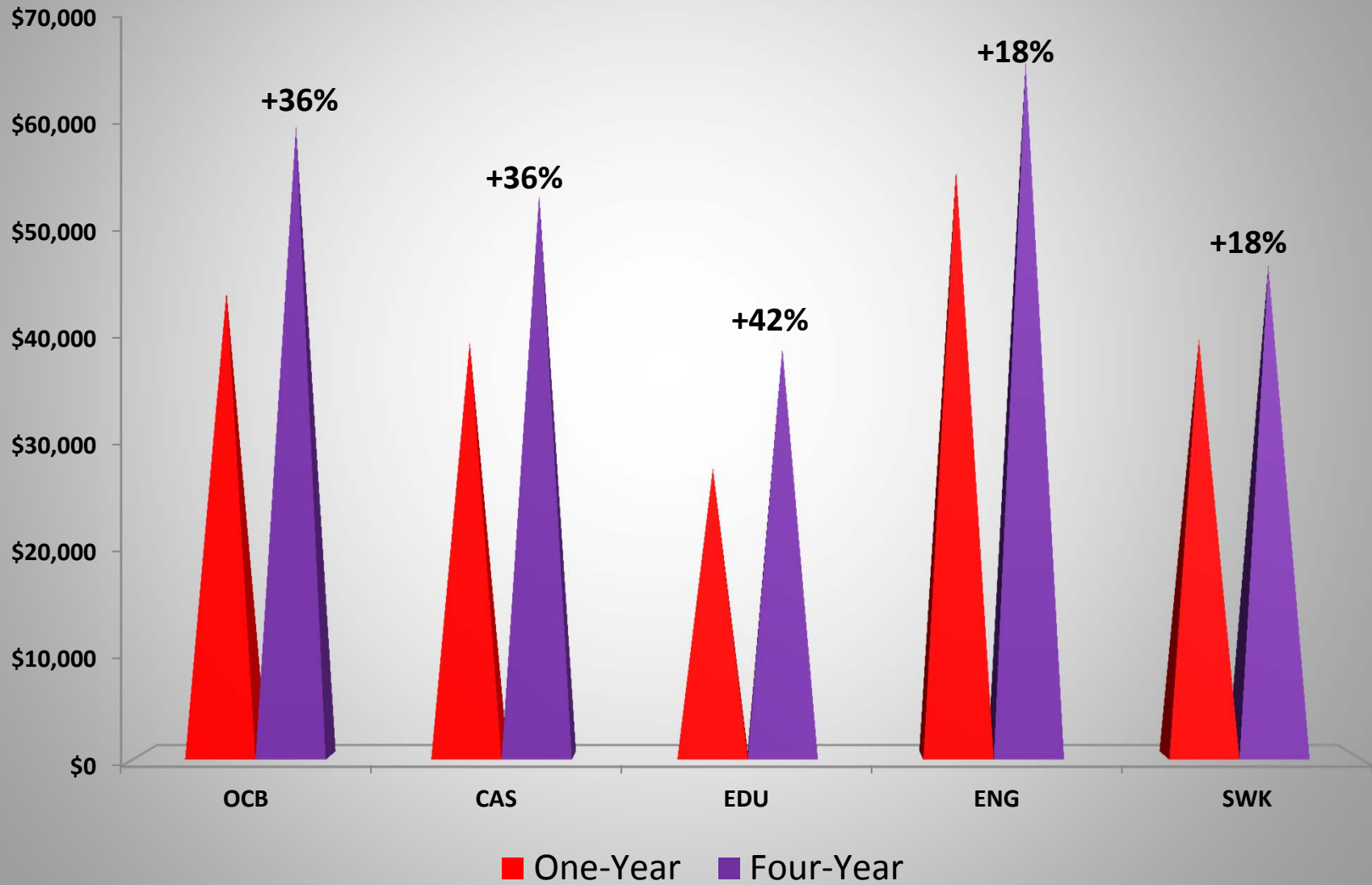

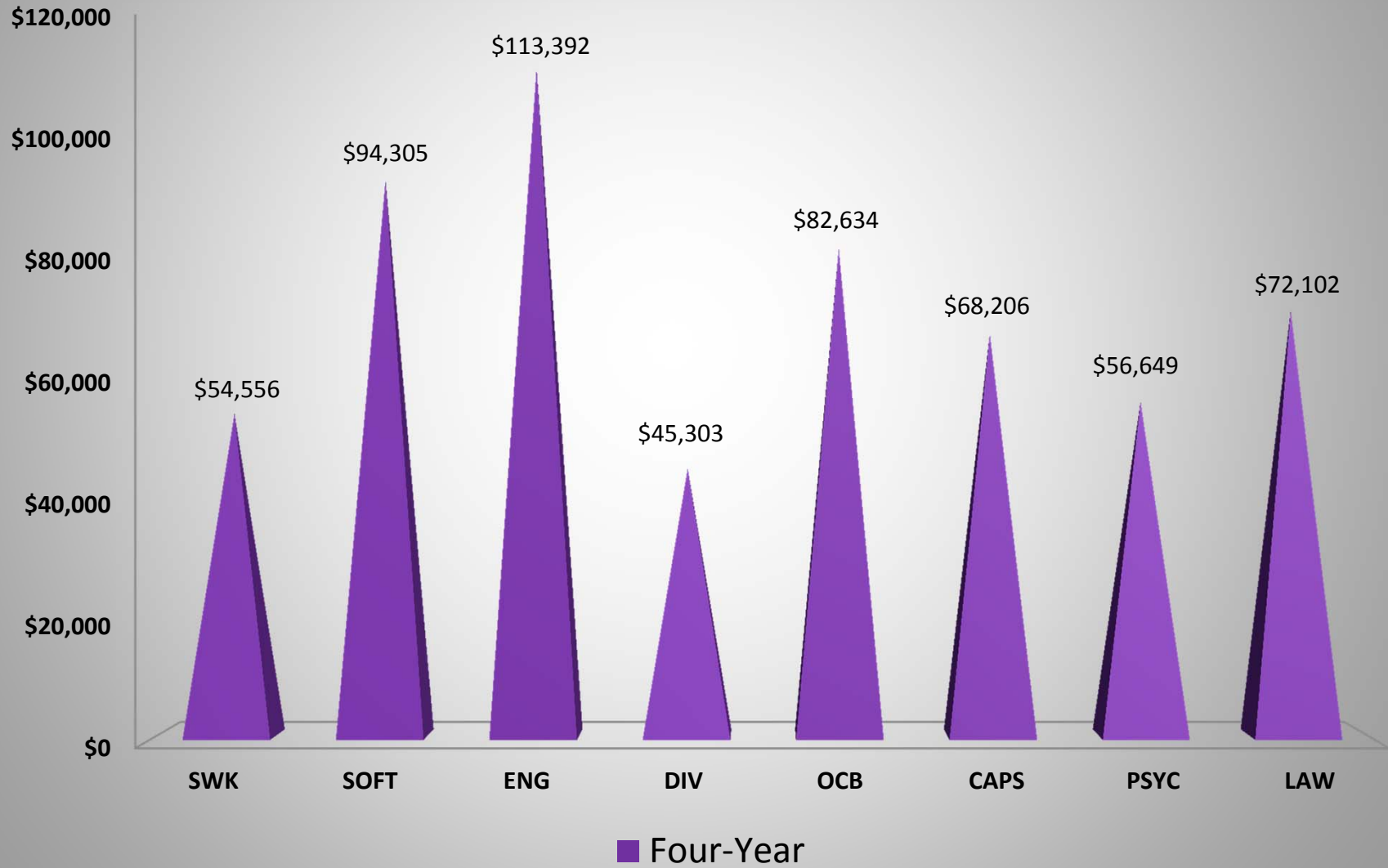


Graduate Degree Recipients Class of 2005

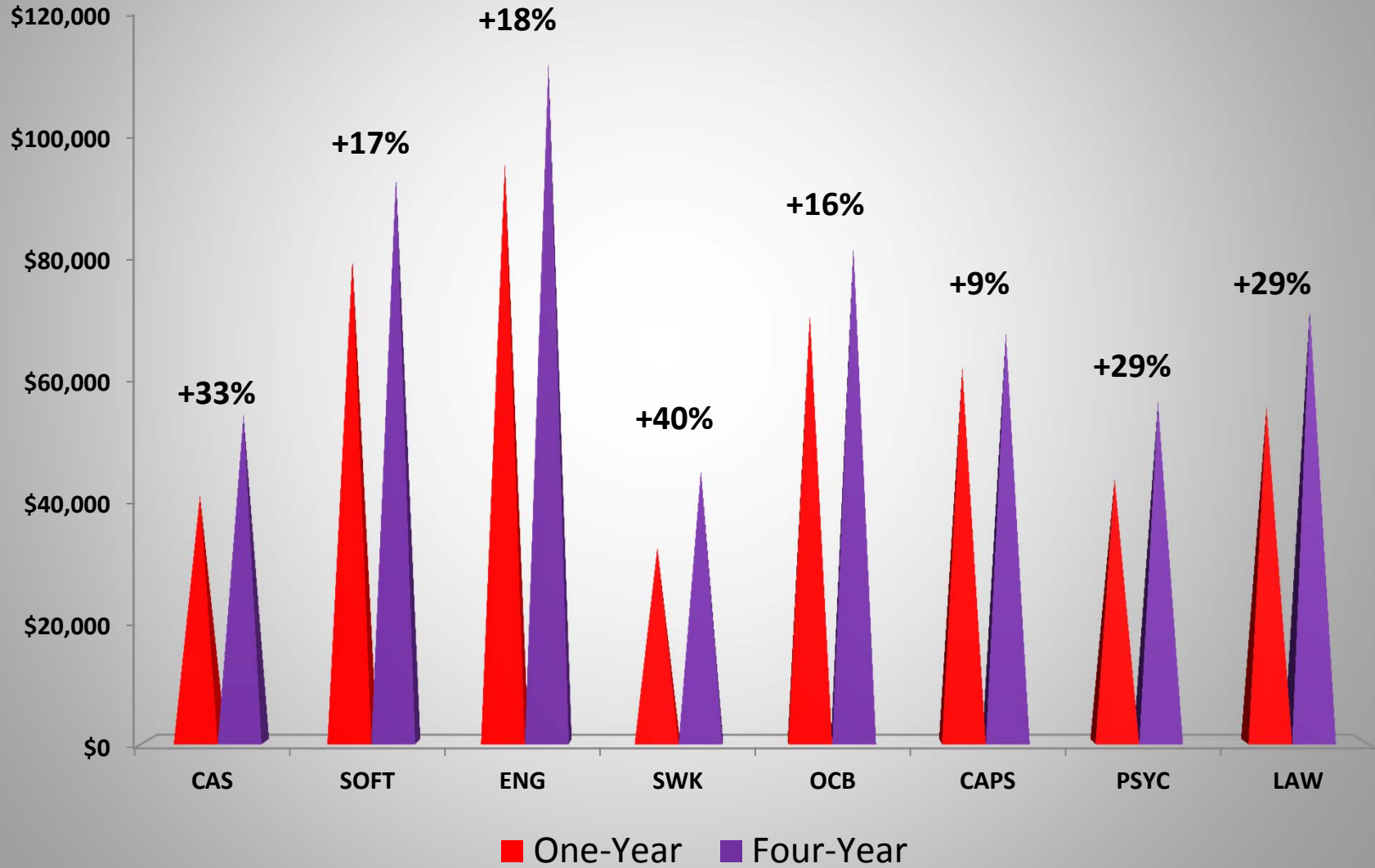

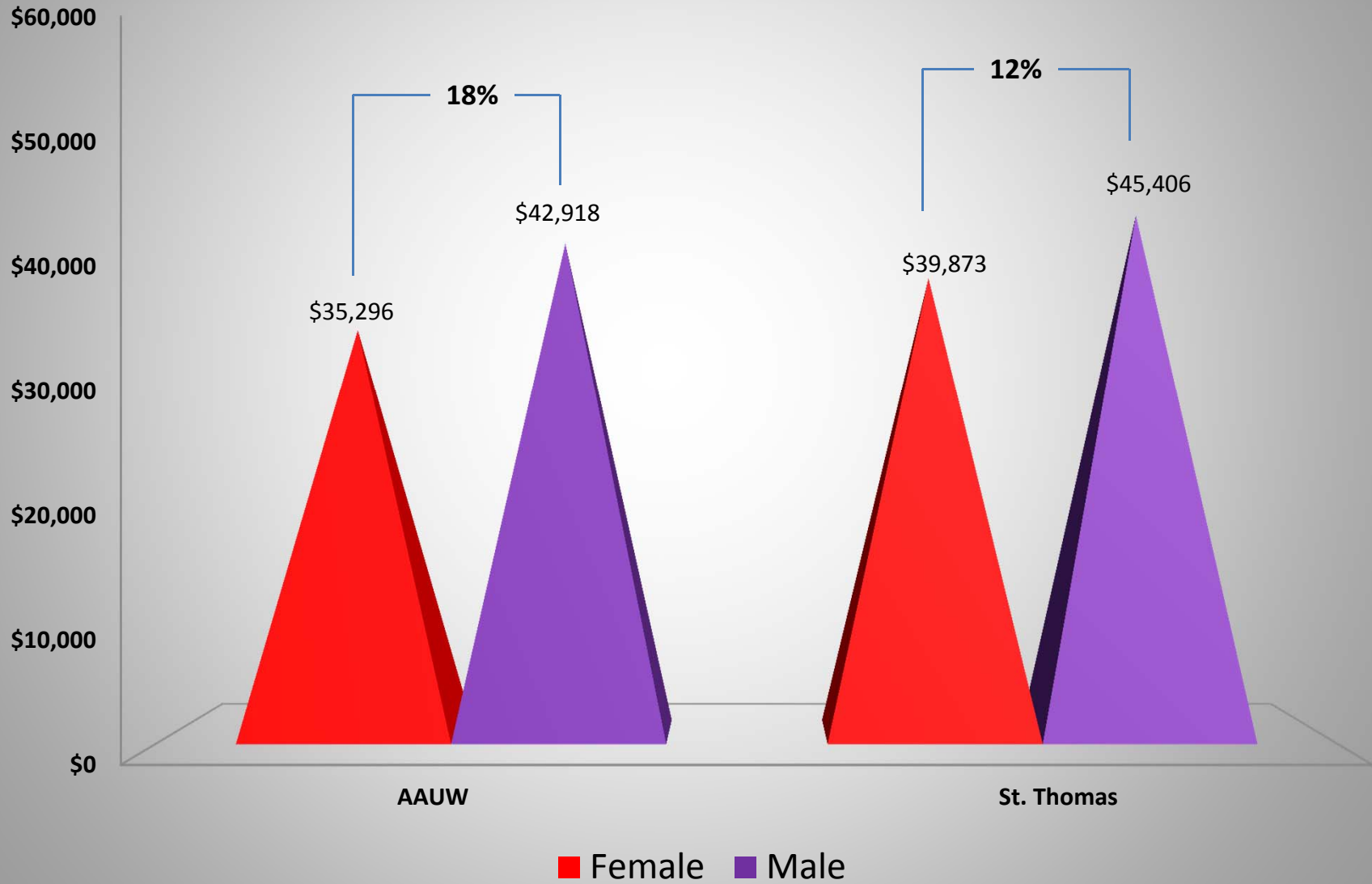
Degree Recipients by Gender

- American Association of University Women (AAUW)
 - The Simple Truth about the Gender Pay Gap (2012)
 - Women typically earned 77% of what men earn overall
- AAUW analysis of Baccalaureate and Beyond
 - Women graduating in 2008-09 earn 82% of what men earn
- Does this hold true for St. Thomas?

Why the Gap?????

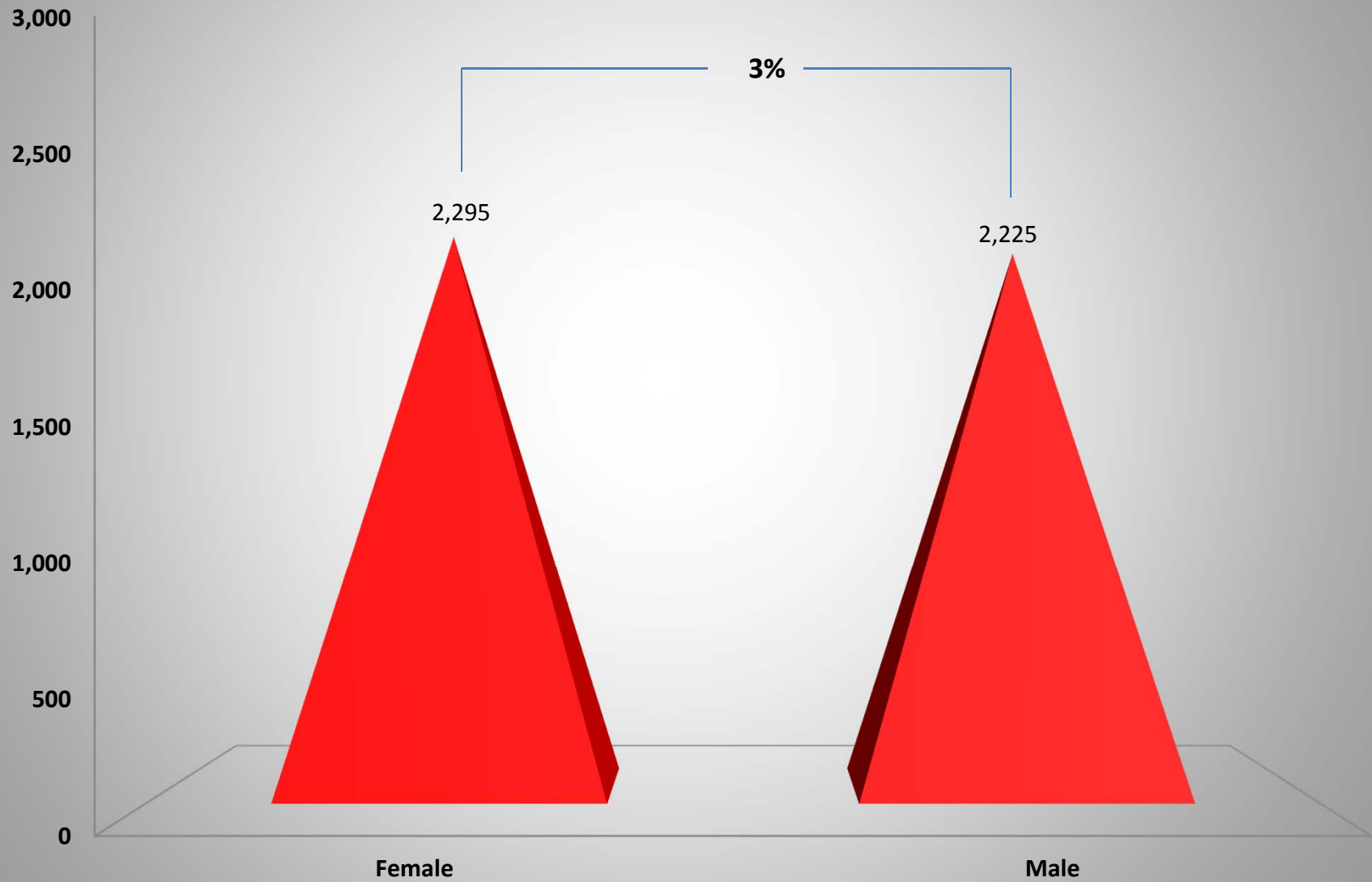
According to AAUW, men typically choose majors that result in more lucrative careers post-graduation, like engineering. Even if men and women major in the same subject, men tend to end up in higher –paying jobs. Men also work more hours.

- Do men earn more money?

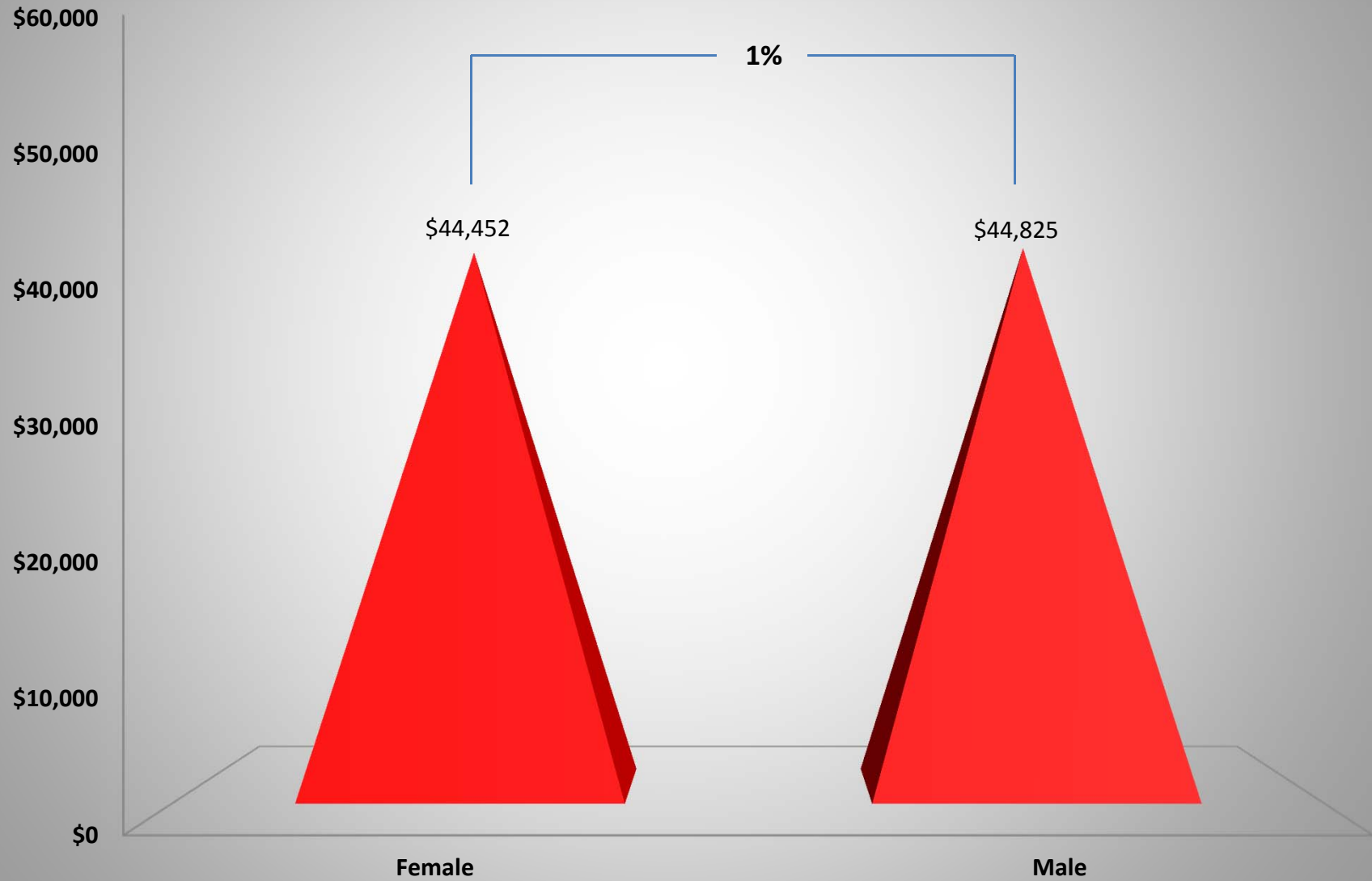
Hours Worked Overall (one year)
